Parents/carers can scan a QR code and make payment for their total spend. Before checking out, please see a member of staff to confirm the total spend and then please show them confirmation that payment has been made.

To buy vouchers in advance of the book fair:

This allows your child to go along to the book fair and buy a book.

Once a purchase has been made, you will receive the voucher in an email which can be printed and given to your child – much safer to carry than cash. Vouchers can be purchased up until midnight on the day before the collection of the Book Fair.
