We were fortunate to welcome four school Governors in to school this week.

INSPIRATION

Excellent governance is essential in every educational setting and we are fortunate to have a committed and knowledgeable Governing body.

On Tuesday, Mr Wardle (Safeguarding Governor) met with one of our Deputy Designated Safeguarding Leads, Mr Comer, to review safeguarding procedures in school. Various topics were discussed, including safe recruitment for staff, volunteers and Governors and online safety. Mr Wardle also spoke with staff to understand how our safeguarding procedures work in





On Wednesday, Dr Bagga (Inclusion Governor) met with our Inclusion Leader, Mrs Kemp to discuss how Manland ensures it's curriculum is adaptive and inclusive. Dr Bagga also met with pupils who talked to him about their experiences of learning at Manland.

On Thursday, Mr Geeson (Pupil Premium Governor) was in school and met with our Pupil Premium Leader, Mr Comer. They discussed how Manland ensures that all pupils have the same experiences at school, both in terms of the curriculum and super curricula activities.

Our Chair of Governors, Mrs Montgomery, was in school on Friday. She regularly meets with Mrs Weeks to ensure the effective strategic leadership of the school. She is a critical friend and provides invaluable support.

Financial Support

We want all our families to get the support they are entitled to and we always want to pass on any cost saving ideas we hear about.

The cost of medical prescriptions is an essential cost for many families. It is worth checking to see if you are entitled to free NHS prescriptions using the <u>eligibility checker</u>.

For families who do not qualify for free NHS prescriptions, the NHS offer a Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PCC) link here The certificate covers all NHS prescriptions for a set price, so although there is an initial outlay, you can save money if you regularly need medication. Generally, if you need more than 3 items in a 3 months, or 11 items in 12 months, it is more cost effective to use a PCC.

The prescription charge in England is £9.65 **per item**. A PPC currently costs: £31.25 for 3 months or £111.60 for 12 months.







Moving On From / To Manland

Secondary School applications

A reminder to all parents with children who applied for a place at a secondary school this year that National Allocation Day is coming up on **1st March 2024**.

If you applied online, the schools admissions team will email you on that day, or you can log in to the admissions system to check your allocation.

If you applied on paper, the schools admissions team will send you a notification letter and response form by first class post.

The deadline for accepting your offer is **15th March 2024**. For those parents/carer who applied online, you can use online facilities to opt out, make a new application a an appeal.

We wanted to remind parents/carers that Manland hires out it's Hall, Kitchen, KS1 play area and toilets on weekends and evenings for children's birthday parties!

The rate is \pounds 40 per hour. Keys and locking up instructions can be picked up from the office the week before the event, and then dropped back to the office after the event.

In the interests of neighbourly relations, we do not hire our the KS2 playground or field. In addition, we do not hire out for adult parties – again, due to neighbourly relations.
