I am writing to congratulate you on your school's outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check.

We want to ensure every child develops a firm grasp of phonics as the basis on which to improve standards of reading. As such I was delighted to see your results.

With 100 per cent of pupils in Year 1 at Manland Primary School meeting the expected standard in the check, your school is in the top 1 per cent of all primary schools in the country.

The latest figures show that 83 per cent of pupils who met the expected standard in the check went on to achieve at least the expected standard in reading at key stage 2 in 2023, which underlines the importance of developing the ability to decode words effectively at an early age.

Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a lifelong love of reading.

I would like to thank you for your commitment and success in this vital area of a child's early education and congratulate you, your staff and pupils again on all you have achieved.

National guidance: Measles outbreaks

There have been recent localised outbreaks of measles centred around the West Midlands. There is a risk of further outbreaks in other areas unless urgent action is taken to increase Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccination take up in areas with low MMR vaccine rates. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. The best protection against measles for children and adults is to get both doses of the MMR vaccine.

Children should have the first dose of the MMR vaccine at 1 year, and the second at 3 years and 4 months.

It is never too late to have these vaccinations – please contact your GP surgery if your child is missing either of these 2 doses.

Healthy Eating - Eat Them to Defeat Them 19th February - 28th March 2024

Eat Them to Defeat Them is returning and, once again, Manland pupils will be taking part in the battle! Eat Them to Defeat Them is a campaign created by Veg Power and ITV to encourage children to eat more vegetables.

After February half term, all pupils at Manland will be provided with a reward chart and a sticker each day they eat vegetables as part of their lunchtime meal.

If you are worried about your child's mood, behaviour and learning, a good place to start is their diet.

Studies have shown that the best diet for good mood, behaviour and learning is one that includes a regular eating pattern and a variety of food with 2-3 handfuls of vegetables per day.
