At Manland, we are ambitious for all our pupils in every subject. This week, as part of their Design and Technology unit, Year 6 planned, made and cooked their own burgers!



Run by chef Graham Chatham (from the Royal College of Culinary Arts), the children's masterclass taught them how to peel and chop onions safely (not a tear was shed!), and prepare their ingredients for fresh salsa to accompany their burger (tomatoes, red onion, chopped parsley and coriander, lemon juice).

Year 6 also made their own homemade BBQ sauce (although this was not to everyone's taste!). Children listened attentively and were eager to master new skills, as they rolled their sleeves up to combine minced beef with chopped onion to first roll their mixture into meatballs, then shape into patties for cooking.

All would agree that the best part was eating freshly made burgers!

Healthy Start - Get help to buy fruit and milk

Did you know, eligible families can qualify for a weekly payment for fresh fruit, vegetables, and milk through the NHS Healthy Start Scheme? This initiative is to support families with the rising cost of living.

If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4, you may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk.

If you're eligible, you'll be sent a Healthy Start card with money on it that you can use in some UK shops. Your benefit will be added onto this card every 4 weeks.

You can use your card to buy:

- plain liquid cow's milk
- · fresh, frozen, and tinned fruit and vegetables
- fresh, dried, and tinned pulses
- infant formula milk based on cow's milk

You can also use your card to collect:

- Healthy Start vitamins these support you during pregnancy and breastfeeding
- vitamin drops for babies and young children these are suitable from birth to 4 years old
