A co-opted Governor is a local member of the community who has skills which can contribute to the effective governance and success of the school. At Manland, we are looking for co-opted Governors with experience of **finance**, **premises**, **or health and safety**.

Becoming a school governor brings amazing rewards and satisfaction. Governors come from every walk of life and there is no requirement to have an educational background. There are many governor roles, so a diverse team with different skills, and work/life experiences is important.

No prior experience of being a Governor is required. Help and support is provided every step of the way to becoming an effective school governor. This includes:

- a comprehensive online and face to face training programme,
- a helpdesk, five days a week, to answer any questions and to access any support

• a variety of webinars and briefings to ensure governors are kept up to date with any education changes.

How much time does being a co-opted Governor typically require?

Our Full Governing body meets six times a year and meetings last 2 hours. Governors also sit on either our Resources or School Improvement Committee, who meet up to 6 times a year. Meetings are generally first thing in the morning or in the evening, to support Governors with work or family commitments. We also recommend Governors undertake a visit to school once a term to monitor the effective governance and success of the school.
