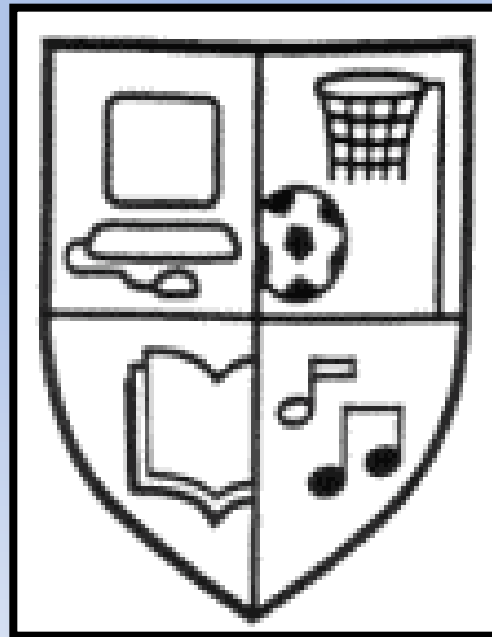

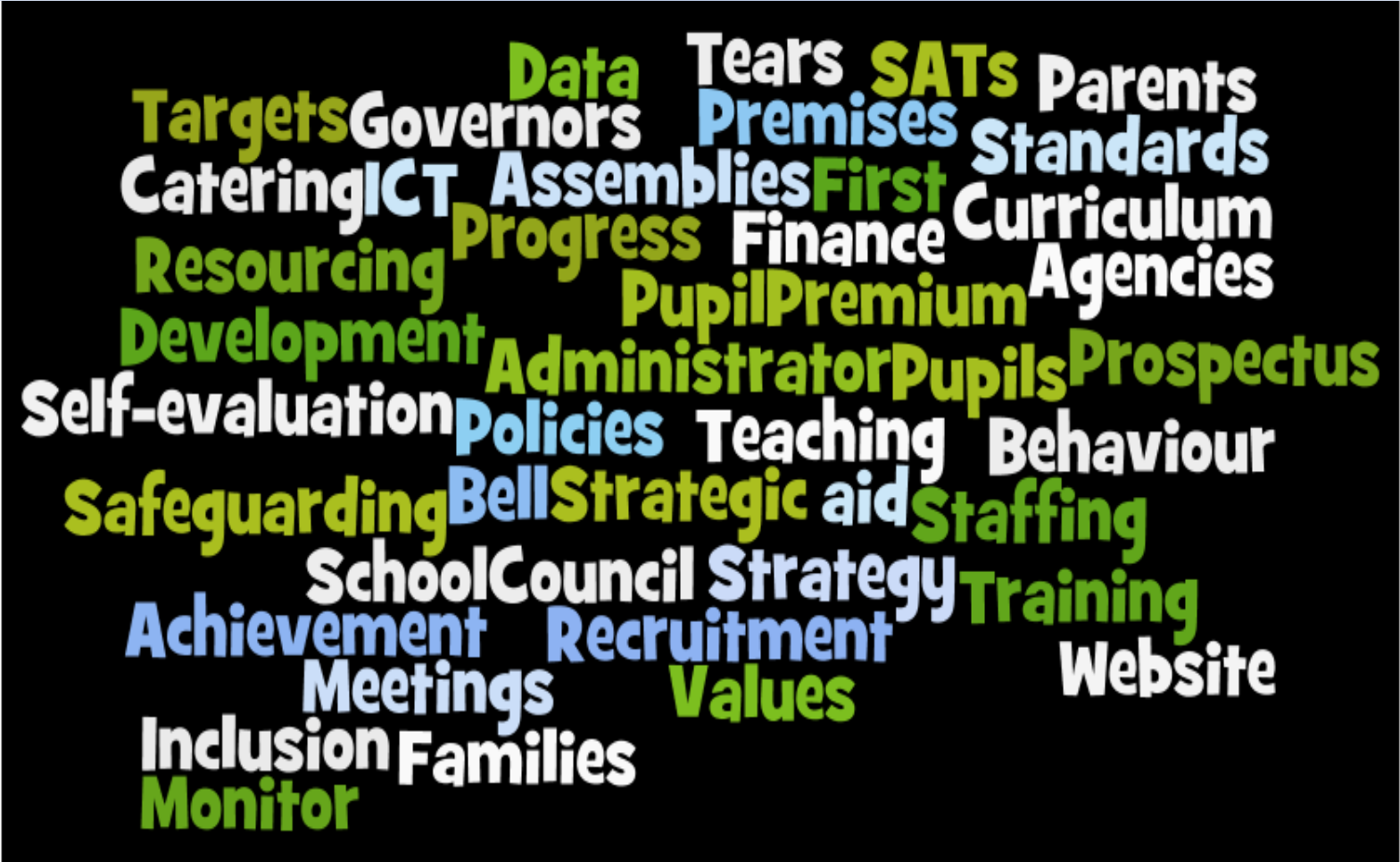

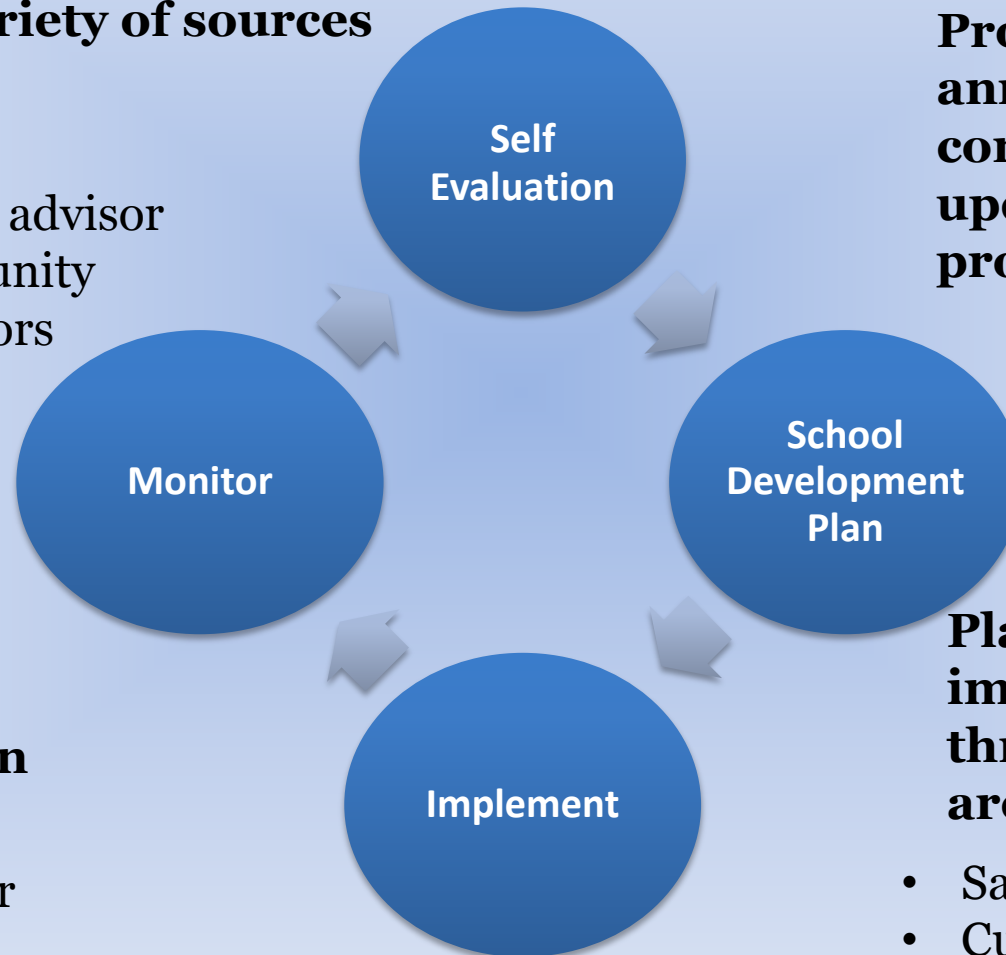
Strategic Leadership Cycle

Independent monitoring ensures effective implementation

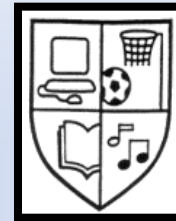

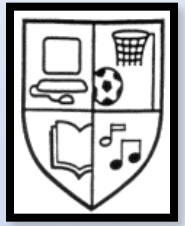

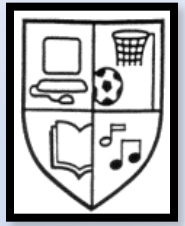

School Development Plan (SDP)



- SDP organised in line with sections of an Ofsted inspection:
 - Effectiveness of Leadership & Management
 - Outcomes for pupils
 - Quality of teaching, learning & assessment
 - Personal development, behaviour & welfare
 - Early Years Foundation Stage
- Within each section we have identified several improvement actions, along with timescales, responsibilities and cost implications
- For each of these as the year progresses, we track implementation, evaluate impact and record evidence

The SDP is a living document and evolves as priorities change



Meet the Governors



- Volunteers drawn from the parents, staff and community of the school
- Governors' role:
 - Strategic, not operational role
 - Provide support and challenge to leadership team
 - Ensure school satisfies statutory requirements
 - Educational, safeguarding, financial, employment law...
 - Oversee the management of the school's resources
 - Agree budget and rolling three year projections; monitor spending against budget during the year
 - Staff deployment, performance management, including Head Teacher's Performance Management
 - Premises, health and safety



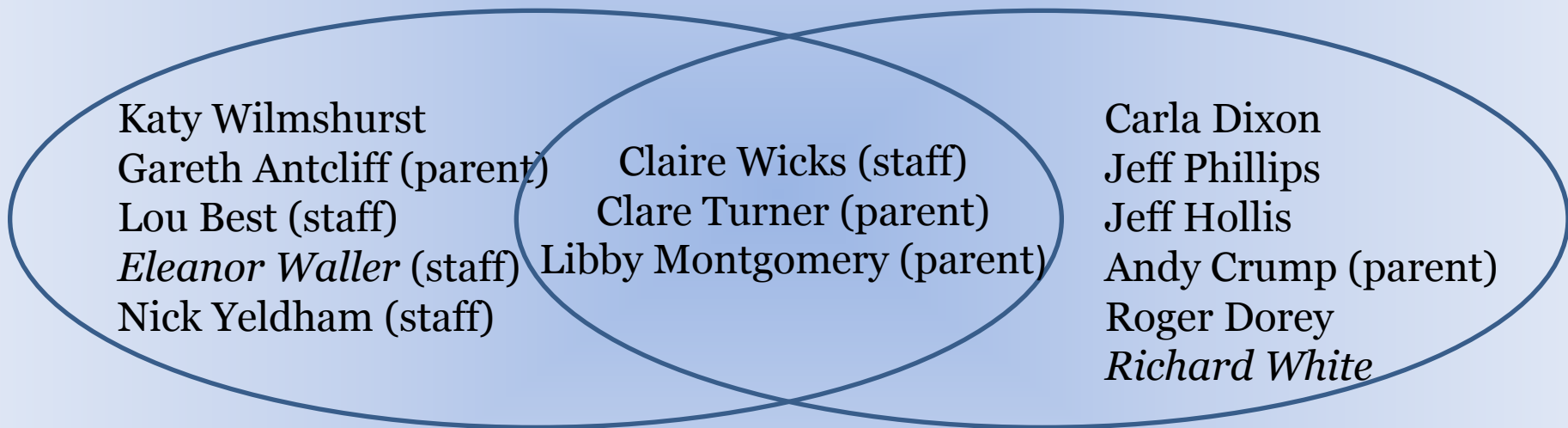
There are fourteen governors, organised into two committees

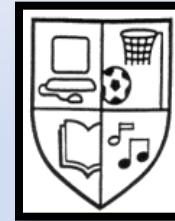
