Our Year 6 Play Leaders would like to say a huge thank you for a life skills grant from Harpenden Lions towards our Play Leader scheme.

At Manland, pupils in Year 6 can volunteer to be a Play Leader. The job of a Play Leader is many and varied. With training from the Key Stage 2 leads and PE teacher, Play Leaders create and deliver positive play experiences for children in our school; whether it be developing a game which teaches children to take turns, a game which helps less confident children find their voice or a game that helps children find a new skill they excel in. Play Leaders use the interests of the children when developing these games. They set the games up, oversee the game, and support children to learn new skills and develop new friendships. The scheme breaks down barriers between year groups.

Our Play Leaders develop their leadership and mentoring skills via this scheme and they are encouraged to be great role models and think of others. Learning these types of skills is an important step in their transition to secondary school and we regularly receive reports from adults around school, complimenting our Play Leaders on their ability to assist with play and reassure younger children.



Oral health

Oral health is an important part of every child's wellbeing. It impacts on the ability for children to eat and sleep, to socialise with confidence and to concentrate at school. However, many children experience problems with their oral health.

Tooth decay affects around a quarter of five-year olds in England and it is also the leading cause of hospital admissions for five to nine-year-olds by some distance. Many children who go to hospital because of tooth decay need to have teeth removed under general anaesthetic.

This is despite the fact that tooth decay is almost entirely preventable.



The key messages for children 3+ are:

- •"Twice a day" which is to encourage brushing your teeth twice a day
- •"Protect their smile" which is a reminder for free NHS dental checks for under 18s
- •"Encourage them to spit not rinse" which is to encourage children to spit not rinse as they get older
- •"Skip the sugar" which is about avoiding food and drinks with too much sugar

When should I take my child to a dentist?

See a dentist as soon as possible if you think you or your child has tooth decay. Early treatment can help stop it getting worse.

NHS dental care in England is free if you are:

- •a child under 18, or under 19 and in full-time education
- •pregnant or have had a baby in the last 12 months

You can also take your child to your own dental appointments so that they get used to the experience. It may help to reduce any fear or worry they may have about visiting the dentist as they grow.







Pupil Premium grant

Government support and financial assistance is available for families who are experiencing hardship. This funding is called the Pupil Premium grant and it is available to any pupil attending a state school in England.

Some of the support families are entitled to as part of the Pupil Premium grant, include:

Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4, 5 and 6)

- · free school meals
- meal vouchers for the holiday periods
- access to free holiday clubs (Herts HAPpy activity camps)
- · assistance with music lesson fees
- · assistance with travel costs

Early Years and Key Stage 1 (Reception, 1 and 2)

- meal vouchers for the holiday periods
- access to free holiday clubs (Herts HAPpy activity camps)

In addition to the above, the school receives funding from the Government for every pupil who qualifies for the pupil premium grant. The school uses this funding to improve the educational outcomes of pupils.

Any parent or carer can make an application for the Pupil Premium grant by visiting www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals. We encourage all parents and carers to apply, even if you suspect the period of hardship will only be temporary (e.g. a parent/carer has been made redundant and is in between jobs).
