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## **Phonics**

In phonics this half term, we will keep using the same sounds we have learned to write longer words. In this summary, C stands for consonant and V stands for vowel. Digraphs are classed as C or V. So a CVCC word might be "sand" or "shift" and a CCVCC word could be "stand" or "crisp".

Tricky words all have a tricky part in them where the letters make different sounds to the ones we have learned so far. For example, in has, the s makes a /z/ sound.
