

### Science

Children will be investigating electricity and how it is used in everyday life. They will understand how each component of a circuit is used and how each piece comes together to power an appliance.

### Geography

Our Local Area: The children will develop a range of skills, including map reading, orienteering, research and presenting data in order to conduct an investigation into the local area and the human impact on it over time.

### English

Treason: Children will use this historical fiction book, set during the reign of Henry VIII as a basis of a range of non-fiction writing, including biographies and discussion texts.

A Midsummer Night's Dream: The children will be reading this and using the book to inspire their own narratives, writing a fantasy story.

### R.E.

Children will explore sacred texts. They will enquire what makes something sacred as well as the purpose of these texts. What is wisdom and where does it come from? What is the impact of these texts and their stories and what influence do they have on members of their religion?

### Computing

Year 4 will be producing a WIKI in order to compile information. They will understand a variety of computer networks and how they can be used to support this. They will continue to use technology in a safe and respectful manner and know what unacceptable behaviours to be aware of.

### Maths

We will be studying time, linking to real-world applications, including finding durations. Children will have the opportunity to establish a secure understanding statistics and work with a range of data in order to present and analyse information.

### Design and Technology

Sewing: Children will develop a range of sewing skills in order to create a pin cushion inspired by the Tudor Rose. The children will learn how to sew safely and effectively in order to create a product that fits its purpose as established by a success criteria.

### PSHE

Relationships: Children will explore the different relationships, with people and animals, in their lives and how these make them feel. They will consider how a relationship might change over time and the impact this has on them. The children will begin to think about romantic relationships and how these might develop in the future.

### Music

Children investigate the history of music and how the way music is performed has changed over time. The children will be introduced to the piece Sumer Is Icumen In, which they will learn to sing and accompany.

Cricket: Children will develop the skills and techniques from KS1. They will develop their throwing, batting and team work skills, following rules to compete within matches. Swimming: Children will continue to develop their swimming skills within our external lessons.
