Safeguarding

#### **Photo Consent and GDPR**

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have been made aware that images of children at school events have been shared by parents/carers on social media. We want to remind all parents and carers that if they take any images of children at school events, that these must not be shared on social media, including any WhatsApp groups (including any class or parent/carer WhatsApp groups). Please also reinforce this message with any wider family members/friends who attend school events.

There are many reasons a parent and carer may not provide consent for their child's image to be shared. In some cases, sharing an image of a child can affect their safety. Safeguarding is the responsibility of everyone in the school community and a child's safety can be compromised if you share images of them on social media.

In addition to safeguarding concerns, the UK General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) can apply in unofficial WhatsApp groups. The parents who administer the WhatsApp groups may be considered data controllers under UK GDPR if they decide what personal data is collected and how it's used. The sharing images of children without parental consent may breach GDPR, especially if the images are identifiable and shared beyond personal use (e.g. public WhatsApp groups or forwarded widely).

#### What can you do - Advice from ICO

Whilst the school has no oversight, or responsibility to monitor WhatsApp groups, the ICO (Information Commissioner's Office) advises that if someone posts a photo of your child online without consent, you can request its removal. If refused, you can escalate to the ICO. If you do notice that an image of your child has been shared on a WhatsApp group, please, in the first instance, contact the "owner" administrator of the group to request the removal of the image. #### **Our Commitment to You**

In Hertfordshire, we are dedicated to working with families to remove barriers to regular attendance wherever possible. We recognise that challenges may arise, and we are here to support you and your child.

#### **Key Expectations**

We ask that all families support the following expectations:

- Children attend school every day it is open, unless they are unwell or have a valid statutory reason
- · Children arrive on time and ready to learn
- Families follow the school's attendance policy
- Parents/carers notify the school promptly when their child is absent unexpectedly
- Medical appointments are scheduled outside of school hours where possible
- Requests for leave of absence are made in advance and only in exceptional circumstances

#### How You Can Help

You play a crucial role in supporting your child's attendance. You can help by:

- Encouraging daily, punctual attendance
- Communicating with the school about any concerns or barriers
- · Engaging with any support offered to avoid the need for more formal interventions

If you have any concerns or need support, please contact your child's school in the first instance. Schools are here to work with families to ensure every child can thrive.






